Investment update - October

Following our latest Investment Committee meeting, changes were made to the Cautious strategy during October's quarterly rebalance. The Henderson Index Linked Bond fund was sold, with some proceeds being reinvested into the Threadneedle Sterling Short Dated Corporate Bond fund, with the balance being retained as cash. The Henderson fund disposal represents a continuation of our current policy to reduce longer duration UK index-linked bond exposure to minimise duration risk within our strategies. Our Investment Committee felt that it was still too soon to be increasing equity risk, which continues to target a 20% weighting within the Cautious strategy, given we are about to enter unchartered waters; the replacement of a decade's worth of crisis monetary policies is likely to be quite troublesome. The strategy has increased European equity exposure to 2%, with the addition of FP Crux European Special Situations fund at the expense of the Franklin UK Managers' Focus fund, as the economic picture in Europe appears to have slightly improved with growth accelerating and political risks subsiding.




