The current debenture series covers the period 2016 to 2020, and the latest price for a single Centre Court debenture earlier in November was about £108,000. The series for 2021 through 2025 will be announced after the Championships in July 2018. Perhaps therefore one for next year.

If you are seeking a second opinion on investment strategy, perhaps some lunch with Warren Buffett? There are occasional charitable offerings from the Sage of Omaha: back in June he offered some lunch in return for a donation to a San Franciscan homeless charity, which at auction went for US\$2.68 million.
